## **APRIL BIRTHSTONE**

The Diamond is the ultimate gemstone, having few weaknesses and much strength. It is well known that Diamond is the hardest substance found in nature, but few realize that it is four times harder than the next hardest natural mineral, corundum (sapphire and ruby). But, even as hard as it is, it is not impervious. A Diamond has four directions of cleavage, meaning that if it receives a sharp blow in one of these directions it will cleave, or split. A skilled diamond setter and/or jeweler will prevent any of these directions from being in a position to be struck while mounted in a jewelry piece. As a gemstone, the Diamond's single flaw (perfect cleavage) is far outdistanced by the sum of its positive qualities. It has a broad color range, high refraction, high dispersion or fire, very low reactivity to chemicals, rarity and, of course, extreme hardness and durability. Diamond is the April Birthstone and is an alternate Zodiac Stone for the Constellation of Aries.

## Four Cheese broiled Tomato Slices

## Ingredients

- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan and Romano cheese blend
- 1/2 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1/2 cup ricotta cheese
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 4 large tomatoes

## Directions

- In a small bowl, combine the first seven ingredients. Cut each tomato into five slices. Spread each with 1 tablespoon cheese mixture.
- Place on an ungreased baking sheet. Broil 3 in. from the heat for 3-5 minutes or until cheese mixture is golden brown and tomatoes are heated through. **Yield:** 20 appetizers.
- Total prep time 20 minutes.
