AUGUST BIRTHSTONE (Peridot)





Peridot of gem quality comes from an island in the Red Sea off the coast of Egypt; Myanmar, Mexico, Ethiopia, Australia, Salt Lake Crater, Arizona, Hawaii, Pakistan, and numerous other countries. Historically the best quality comes from Myanmar or Egypt. Arizona peridot is of a lesser quality but is more abundant and more affordable. 80 – 85% of all peridot comes from Arizona. Peridot from Myanmar, Pakistan and Egypt are rarer and more valuable.

- When hiking from the group, always take a radio. RADIOS: Channel 3
- Name badges required at all Club functions.
- Maximum of 25 lbs. of rock per trip. Maximum of 250 lbs. of rock annually.
