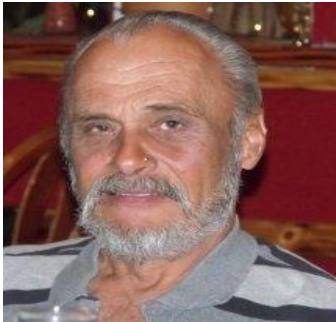

December Birthstone

Birthstone for December is the Turquoise. So named because it was initially brought to Europe by way of Turkey, this stone is one of the first gems to be used in jewelry. Turquoise was considered by ancients to be a sacred stone, protective against all manners of evil and ill health. This beautiful gemstone is mined in Iran and the southwestern United States.

Blue Topaz is the hardest of the silicate minerals. While pure Topaz is colorless, minor changes of elements within the stone result in a variety of other colors, such as blue, pale green, red, yellow and pink.

I remember a vivid blue Zircon ring my parents gave me for my birthday one year, and until recently, thought that it was the one true stone for December. Go figure.

If cold December gave you birth, The month of snow and ice and mirth,
Place on your hand a stone of blue; Success will bless whate'er you do.

The accepted stones for the month of December are Turquoise, Zircon, Blue Topaz, and Tanzanite.
